Dear Families,
We are nearing the end of week 6 out of 9 for the term and things have been flying along with more great opportunities to come.

NAPLAN starts next week for our grade 3 and 5 students. You will find a sheet attached to the newsletter that has information about NAPLAN. However, if you have any questions, please reach out to myself or Renee.
The Waratah Cluster Athletics Carnival is coming up on the $22^{\text {nd }}$ of March for students in grade 3 and up. On this day parents/carers are asked to transport their children to Foster Secondary College for a 9am start. Students will need to come wearing their school polo shirt and appropriate clothing and footwear for running, jumping and throwing. Our staff will already be there to meet you on arrival.

The love of reading and being read to has such positive impact in children's lives that goes beyond just hearing about stories. Books for kids actually contain $50 \%$ more words than what children will encounter frequently with regular conversation, TV or radio. What a great way to build their vocabulary!
Following a discussion amongst staff and with School Council we have decided to reward one student from each class with a $\$ 20.00$ Book Club voucher for reading the most nights in

their class for the term. So please encourage your children to read every night and don't forget to record it in their reading diaries.
We are currently running our Breakfast Club only once a week when Sue is here on a Thursday. We would love to offer this to our students more often. To do this, we need some volunteers who could come in before school and run the breakfast program. This will only take up about 30-45 minutes of your time. ## Auslan

Last week in Auslan we learnt to sign the alphabet. We also learnt to finger spell our names. Finger spelling can be tricky, and I have encouraged the students to practice, practice, practice!

This week we talked about Hearing Awareness week and explored some lipreading. (senior class). I also introduced numbers 1-20 and the junior class linked them to family members.... 2 brothers, 3 sisters etc.

Ask your child to teach you the signs that they have been taught. This helps them to remember the signs.
FACT- There are 2 dialects in Auslan. Northern and Southern. Here in Victoria, we use the Southern dialect. The most noticeable dialects will be colours and numbers. It is common to see north signs used down south and vice versa.

Why do students do NAPLAN?
Why do students do NAPLAN?
The National Assessment Program - Literacy and
Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each students have the opportunity to undertake.
As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the
NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment
and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with additional
information about students' educational progress. NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities
and governments with information about how education
programs are working and whether young Australians programs are working and whether young Australians
are achieving important educational outcomes in
literacy and numeracy. Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online
Online NAPLAN tests are designed to provide precise results and are engaging for students. The tests are tailored (or adaptive) which means that each test depending on a student's responses. This helps
students remain engaged with the assessment.
Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement based on both the number and complexity of questions concerned if they find questions challenging: they may
