I had the pleasure of attending the first School Council meeting for 2024 and was incredibly impressed with what Vanessa and the team have achieved, with fundraising being a big stand out. The role they play is so significant for our students and one example of this is seeing the smiles and joy on the faces on our students when they play on the new playground. Thidwas the beneficiary of fundraising by the team and the community. Another important role of the Council is to provide feedback to the Principal in relation to how we can continually progress in being the best school we can be. During the meeting we also requested feedback around attendance. Tarwin Lower PS goal for 2024 is to take the average days absent per year of our students from 22 in 2023 down to 18 for this year. Tarwin Lower is unfortunately well below state average for attendance. We will be working with families to gain feedback on how we can improve in this area, with School Council already sharing some great ideas. We handed out the Victorian Department of Education Guidelines to Attendance at Parent Teacher Conferences so if you couldn't attend, you will find it attached to this newsletter. The content in the Guidelines may come across a bit harsh however the reality is that an average of

20 days per year is the equivalent of over a year of school lost by the time the student reaches year 12. This puts them at a major life-long disadvantage.

FACT- Auslan is written with only a capital letter at the beginning and not fully capitalised. Auslan stands for Australian sign language.




