The School Sleepover and Afternoon Fun, was a great success. Despite some students challenging each other to stay awake for a midnight feast and to not sleep at all. Everyone managed to get to sleep. The following day at school was toned down a bit to cater for some very tired students (and teachers). Lindy and Sue put in a huge effort, making dinner for nearly 50 students. Students were polite and appreciative for dinner and some even offered to help clean up!

Camp is coming up for Grade 5/6 during week 2 of next term, the School Sleepover will provide them with the confidence that they will be able to last the 2 nights away from their family and things.

Recently I've been doing some research on the importance of children regularly attending school and one quote I read stood out more than all the others.



The quote was simply - **MISSING SCHOOL = MISSING OUT!**

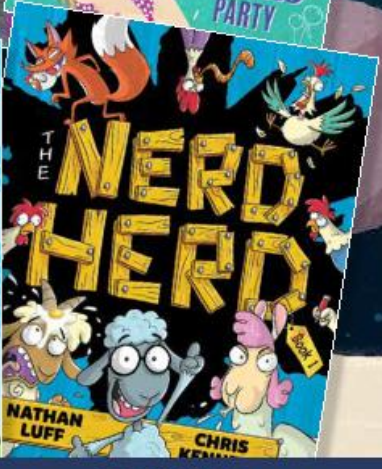
